<b>Red Oak</b>	<b>12-18" seedling.</b> A straight growing tall (80-90 feet) shade tree. Tolerant of many soils and varied conditions. This acorn tree provides food and shelter for wildlife including deer, squirrels, and birds.	<b>\$25.00</b>		
<b>White Oak</b>	<b>12-18" seedling.</b> Hardy deciduous shade tree grows up to 100 feet tall. Moderate growth rate and long lived. They prefer moist, well-drained soils. Acorns are eaten by turkey, ruffed grouse, and blue jay.	<b>\$25.00</b>		
<b>Red Maple</b>	<b>12-24" seedling.</b> Shade tree with glossy green leaves. Fall colors vary from yellow to scarlet. Adaptable to a wide range of site conditions. Tolerates wet or dry soils. Mature height 50-60 ft. Spreads 40 feet.	<b>\$25.00</b>		
<b>White Pine</b>	<b>7-15" 2-year transplant.</b> Fast growing open tree with long, soft, bluish-green needles will grow up to 80 feet tall. It adapts to dryer sites if not planted too closely together. The White Pine is recommended as a windbreak and good for wildlife cover.	<b>\$20.00</b>		
<b>White Spruce</b>	<b>7-15" 2-year transplant.</b> Moderate growing tree (40-60 feet) that prefers cool, moist sites. A popular ornamental and windbreak tree with bluish-green needles and short dense branches. Provides winter cover and habitat for wildlife including deer and ruffed grouse.	<b>\$20.00</b>		
<b>Colorado Blue Spruce</b>	<b>12-16" 2-year transplant.</b> Slow growing, densely formed tree with stiff, silvery-blue to bluish-green needles. An excellent ornamental tree. Thrives in dry, well-drained soils and on south facing slopes. Grows over 35 feet tall.	<b>\$20.00</b>
